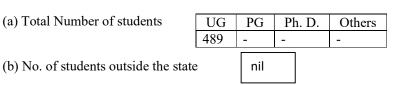

- 5. To occupy Science Classroom-cum-Laboratory building as soon as possible.
- 6. To have a Basket Ball court at the main campus.
- 7. Vertical extension of the main classroom building to have more classrooms, smart classroom, meeting hall, and seminar/conference room.
